Session Locations

Fairbanks Church

583 Fairbanks Road, Farmington

Heading North out of Farmington on Route 4/27. Go Past Jack's trading post and the turn off for Route 27, the Church is located on the right

Franklin County Children's Task Force(FCCTF)

113 Church St, Farmington

At the lights in downtown Farmington, continue North on Rt 4/27, just after Java Joes and before the big court building turn right onto Church Street. FCCTF is about ¾ of the way up the road and is on the right

Farmington Head Start and Child Care Center

103 Deerfield Lane, Farmington

Just past the Farmington Fairground, turn onto Cascade Leisure Road, follow the road to the top of the hill, Turn left onto Galilee Road. Follow that road to the end. The center is located on the right Start

Strong Elementary School

110 N Main St, Strong

After crossing the Strong bridge continue through town, passing the White Elephant, the old Beal's Store and two churches. The School will be on your left.

Henderson Memorial Church

110 Academy Street, Farmington

From McDonalds in Farmington, follow Route 4 North. Just after UMF, take a right onto Academy Street. The church is on the left. Parking is very difficult at this location due to the many UMF vehicles. Please plan extra time for parking

Wilton Head Start

Rt. 2 East, Wilton

From Farmington, Follow Route 2 East into Wilton. After the intersection, near Gould's Service Station and Rick's Market, proceed up the hill. About ½ way up on the left you will see Wilton Head Start and Childcare
